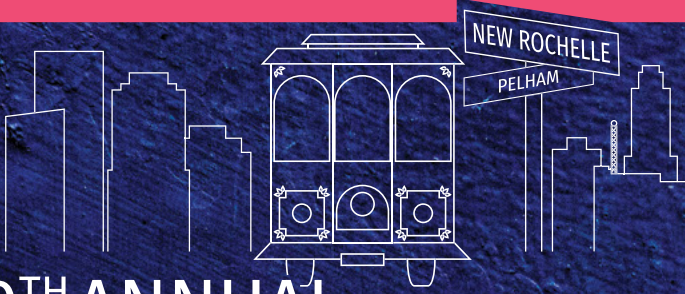

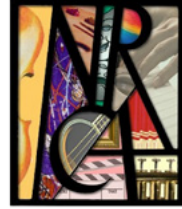

What is ArtsFest?

Since 2009 ArtsFest has been a fall tradition, a weekend long festival celebrating the arts in New Rochelle and Pelham with art exhibits, open artists' studios, live music and dance, spoken word performances, a classic car show and more. ArtsFest is organized every year by the New Rochelle Council on the Arts, a 501 c 3 organization founded in 1975.



What is the New Rochelle Council on the Arts?



Throughout its history the City of New Rochelle has been home to people responsible for shaping the cultural and artistic fabric of America, and over the last four decades the New Rochelle Council on the Arts (NRCA) has supported that tradition. NRCA serves as an umbrella organization for arts organizations and artists, as well as a resource for business and educational partners. NRCA is dedicated to expanding the public's interest and participation in the arts by sponsoring a broad array of art exhibitions, theatrical productions, dance performances, film screenings, art forums, spoken word events and concerts that represent the rich diversity of our community. Ongoing programs include the Summer Sounds Concert Series at Hudson Park Band Shell, quarterly exhibits at NRCA's Rotunda Gallery at City Hall, and ArtsFest.

In collaboration with **Street Art for Mankind (SAM)** and the **City of New Rochelle**, the **NRCA** will kick off **ArtsFest** by introducing

NEW ROCHELLE'S MURALS PROJECT

Friday, October 4th at 4:00 pm



The murals, created by an international group of prominent street artists organized by SAM, are an ode to New Rochelle's vibrant, creative and diverse community. They are based on themes developed with input from City Historian Barbara Davis, the New Rochelle Council on the Arts and the City of New Rochelle, to celebrate the incredible legacy of the city, that continues to fuel its dynamism today.

The murals will be linked by a free, downloadable app, "Behind the Wall", which combines augmented reality content and audioguide features, making the murals truly interactive. The app, developed by SAM, lets viewers hear local children and the mural artists themselves talk about the stories behind each mural and the creative process of each artist. New Rochelle's Murals join SAM's other projects in midtown New York, Larchmont and Mamaroneck, together forming a continuous belt of street art starting near Grand Central and continuing along the Sound Shore.

Street Art for Mankind (SAM) is a nonprofit 501(C)(3) organization which strongly believes in the ability of art to trigger social change. SAM acts as amplifiers of the fight against child trafficking through street art. With the support of 50+ prominent international street artists, SAM creates exhibitions, live performances and murals around the world to bring awareness and raise funds to stop child trafficking. Proceeds from selling the art pieces support raid and rescue programs. SAM's work has been featured in stories on CNN, BBC, WPIX 11, NBC New York, Time Out.

Highbrook Highline: Self Guided Tours (Highbrook Avenue Bridge, Pelham) In 2016, the New York, Westchester & Boston Railway and Highbrook Avenue Bridge in Pelham were listed on the National Register of Historic Places. This 2-acre railbed is being transformed into a passive walk-through greenway and bird sanctuary, with the 1910 Highbrook Avenue Bridge providing a connective greenway as the center piece of the “Highbrook Highline.” The bridge will feature artwork on display for ArtsFest. Open until dusk.



New Rochelle Walk of Fame (Ruby Dee Park) Installed in 2011, the **New Rochelle Walk of Fame** is a tribute to some of New Rochelle's most notable residents throughout the city's 325-year history. The signs, located along the park's outer pathway, present a micro history of America with figures representing the arts, business, politics, education, the media, entertainment and sports. The Walk of Fame was created and funded by former resident and historian Roderick Kennedy Jr., working with the Downtown BID, the New Rochelle Dept. of Parks and Recreation, and City Historian Barbara Davis.

Pop-Up Libraries (various locations)
